Murdoch is photographed in front of The Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Depot, which was constructed in 1875. It was the first to provide rail service to Littleton and is one of the last remaining 19th-century stone depots in the nation.

This Basset Hound is a resident of Littleton and thinks he would make a "pawfect" mayor for his hometown. You may recognize him from his frequent walks along the South Platte River Trail. In addition to having long ears, Murdoch has a big heart and loves to make people happy.





Netty

Netty is photographed in front of the Batschelet Building. Prominent businessman Edward F. Batschelet, who operated a large ranch near Sedalia, built this two-story structure in 1908. The Littleton Museum considers the Batschelet Building "one of the finest remaining turn-of-the-century structures in Downtown Littleton."

This French Bulldog spends a lot of time in Historic Downtown Littleton.





Nova

Nova is photographed in front of the signature Town Hall building located in the heart of Downtown Littleton at 2450 W. Main St. It was constructed in 1920 and served as Littleton's Town Hall until 1977.

Nova loves to explore the great city of Littleton. And Nova lives in a nearby house built in 1909—taking daily walks to Historic Downtown Littleton to greet fellow canines and their owners.





Red

Red is photographed in front of Littleton's first drivable fire truck: The Federal. Did you know that Littleton Fire Rescue started as a volunteer department in 1892? It wasn't until 1960 that the department started using professional firefighters, like Red's grandpa and dad.

Red has grown up in Littleton and enjoys hanging out in the Downtown Historic District at such places as Jackass Brewery and Ned Kelly's.

Sugaree is photographed in front of the landmark Carnegie building, where the City of Littleton's first public library opened in 1917. For the last two decades, it has been the location of The Melting Pot restaurant.

Wilbur is photographed in front of the iconic Arapahoe County Courthouse building, which was built in 1907 and later restored.
